4.5% of adults in the U.S. identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender or queer (LGBTQ+).














LGBTQ+ Stands for... 01. Lesbian 03. B

a woman who has a romantic and/or sexual orientation toward women.

03. Bisexual

A person who experiences sexual, romantic, physical, and/or spiritual attraction to more than one gender, not necessarily at the same time, in the same way, or to the same degree.

05. Queer

Used in different ways and means different things: 1)
Attraction to people of many genders. 2) Don't conform to cultural norms around gender and/or sexuality. 3) A general term referring to all non-heterosexual people.

02. Gay

Used in some cultural settings to represent men who are attracted to men in a romantic, erotic and/or emotional sense.

04. Transgender 06. +

A person whose sense of personal identity or gender does not correspond to the sex they were assigned at birth, or does not conform to gender stereotypes.

LGBTQ+ Sexual Orientation (Who you're attracted to)

QUESTIONING: An individual who is unsure of and/or exploring their gender identity and/or sexual orientation.

ASEXUAL: A person who experiences little or no sexual attraction to others and/or a lack of interest in sexual relationships/behavior. They may or may not experience emotional, physical, or romantic attraction. Asexuality differs from celibacy in that it is a sexual orientation, not a choice.

PANSEXUAL: A person who experiences sexual, romantic, physical, and/or spiritual attraction for members of all gender identities/expressions.

AROMANTIC: A person who experiences little or no romantic attraction to others and/or has a lack of interest in romantic relationships/behavior.
