



A LITTLE HELP...

LGBTQ+ Gender Identity / Expression (how you understand yourself)

GENDERQUEER: A person who does not identify or express their gender within the gender binary.

// NON-BINARY or ENBY: Someone who does not identify exclusively as a man or a woman. Non-binary people may identify as being both a man and a woman, somewhere in between or falling outside of these categories.

// GENDER NON-CONFORMING: an umbrella term referring to people who do not identify in a way that conforms to the traditional expectations of their gender, or whose gender expression does not fit neatly into a category.

AGENDER: a person with no (or very little) connection to gender. Someone who sees themselves as existing without gender.

TRANSGENDER: A person whose sense of personal identity or gender does not correspond to the sex they were assigned at birth.

Overlap happens between gender non-conforming, non-binary, genderqueer, genderfluid

Some nonbinary & gender non conforming also identify as transgender

Wait, there's more...

- Agender having no gender or being genderless
- Androgyne identifying somewhere in between man and woman
- Bigender having two gender identities, either at the same time or interchangeably
- Demiboy partially, but not completely, identifying as a man, boy, or masculine person
- Demigender having partial connection with one gender (male, female, or other)
- Demigirl partially, but not completely, identifying as a woman, girl, or feminine person
- Genderfluid moving between two or more gender identities at different times, in different circumstances, etc.

- Multigender having more than one gender
- Neutrois neutral or null gender, similar to agender
- Pangender- having many or all genders within one's culture
- Transfeminine or Transfem a person assigned male at birth (AMAB) who identifies with a feminine gender, but does not necessarily identify as a woman
- Transmasculine or Transmasc a person assigned female at birth (AFAB) who identifies with a masculine gender, but does not necessarily identify as a man



HETEROSEXISM: Prejudice against individuals and groups who display non-heterosexual behaviors or identities, combined with the majority power to impose such prejudice. Usually used to the advantage of the group in power. Any attitude, action, or practice backed by an institutional power that subordinates people because of their sexual orientation.

CISGENDER: A person whose sense of personal identity or gender does correspond to the sex they were assigned at birth.

LGBTQ2S+ ALLY: Someone who confronts heterosexism, anti-LGBTQ2S+ biases, heterosexual and cisgender privilege in themselves and others; believes that heterosexism, homophobia, biphobia, and transphobia are social justice issues.



And אֱלֹהִים is the plural expression of God.



Gender Pronouns

Please note that these are not the only pronouns. There are an infinite number of pronouns as new ones emerge in our language. Always ask someone for their pronouns.

Subjective	Objective	Possessive	Reflexive	Example
She	Her	Hers	Herself	She is speaking. I listened to her. The backpack is hers.
He	Him	His	Himself	He is speaking. I listened to him. The backpack is his.
They	Them	Theirs	Themself	They are speaking. I listened to them. The backpack is theirs.
Ze	Hir/Zir	Hirs/Zirs	Hirself/ Zirself	Ze is speaking. I listened to hir. The backpack is zirs.
